Father Lesch was born in Chicago, and attended St. Joseph College in Rennselaer, Ind. after attending Catholic schools in his home city. He pursued studies for the the Precious Blood, and was ordained at St. Charles Seminary, Carthagena, Ohio, Dec. 10, 1944.

He was assigned to Wisconsin, Colorado, and Ohio before he joined the Air Force, entering military service during the Korean conflict. On Jan. 1, 1980, Father Lesch retires as a full colonel after 30

years of service.




